Module 1 – Starting Your Business

These are all questions anyone starting a business for the first time will ask.

In this module you'll find answers to these questions and more. We'll start with the basics and give you information on the necessary activities involved in starting your business.

We'll also give you questions to ask – questions to ask yourself, your attorney and your accountant. The answers to these questions will help guide you in starting and operating a successful business.

The business plan section will also include information and tips for marketing your business and getting new clients.

- **Legal** This section provides an understanding of the different legal forms that are options for your business.
 - It will give you suggestions to find an attorney if you don't already have one, and includes suggested questions to ask your attorney, so that you understand your legal liabilities and obligations as a business owner.
- **Finance and Accounting** This section provides background to understand different accounting terms options for your own business. You will learn about different methods of finance tracking to help select the right one for you.
- It also includes questions to ask your accountant and a quick-start list to get you off on the right foot.
- Business Plan This section provides information for both a full business plan, which can be used if you are going to obtain financing business and a "short form" which can be used if you are not getting outside funding. Both have questions that you should answer so that you are clear about your goals, priorities and operating guidelines.
- Developing a Website This section provides information for setting up your website, and suggested content include with specific examples.
 - It also includes a lot of information on whether or not to design the site yourself or hire a professional designer and guidelines for both options.
- Toolkit This section includes more detailed information on several topics, website
 page examples and templates.
